
In this project we defined three PhD-projects:


- (1) The emergence of Football citizenship and its discontent, 1930-2014

- (3) Sport in the city: migrant players, race and fandom (Rotterdam, Calcutta and Bankok)








Who Belongs to the Nation? Who may represent the Nation? A Global Continuum of **Thick** and **Thin** Citizenship Cases (Oonk 2018)






Olympic athletes who represented two or more countries 1948-2012

Sifan Hassan (Siifan Hassan; born 1993) is an Ethiopian-Dutch middle- and long-distance runner. She is the Dutch indoor record holder for the 1500 metres and 3000 metres.

Hassan won the gold medal at 1500 m at the European Athletics Championships Zürich 2014 and won two bronze medal at the World Championships, in 2015 in the 1500 metres event and in 2017 in the 5000 metres event.



Nageeye added extra excitement to the marathon by running a new Dutch record of 2.08.16. Thanks to his strong final sprint towards the finish, Nageeye ran five seconds faster than the previous record set by Kamiel Maase.
