


Montenegro's sport system

- Interventionist
- Centralized
- Consolidated
- Law on public administration/Law on public servants/Anticorruption Law
- Enabling and stimulating PEPs to be in charge of sport organization
- As a direct consequence, political representatives, most often from the governmental level, are dominantly represented within governing and internal audit bodies of federations
- Resulting in inability to tackle numerous corruption cases (Chess, Wrestling, among others)




